

RESOLUTION NO. 87-2016

A RESOLUTION DECLARING TWO VILLAGE POLICE VEHICLES AS SURPLUS PROPERTY NO LONGER NEEDED FOR PUBLIC USE, AND AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE TO SELL SAID PROPERTY BY INTERNET AUCTION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Revised Code §721.15 allows for this Council to adopt a Resolution authorizing the sale of personal property, including motor vehicles, and other personal property and equipment referenced in Revised Code §721.15, which is no longer needed for public use, or is obsolete, or is unfit for the use for which it was required, by internet auction; and

WHEREAS, this Council in Resolution 50-2016 authorized the sale of surplus Village personal property by Internet auction and authorized the Mayor and Finance Director to enter into an appropriate Internet auction contract; and

WHEREAS, the Finance Director and Police Chief have recommended that the Village utilize GovDeals.com for purposes of Internet auctions of surplus personal property of the Village; and

WHEREAS, this Council has received a recommendation from the Police Chief that the following police vehicles are no longer needed for public use, are obsolete, or are unfit for the use for which they were acquired, and, thus, are surplus property and should be disposed of:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Richfield, Summit County, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the following police vehicles are no longer needed for public use, are obsolete, or are unfit for the use for which they were acquired, and, thus, are surplus property and available for disposition by Internet auction:


2013 Ford Taurus, VIN # 1FAHP2MK4DG206558
2013 Ford Taurus, VIN # 1FAHP2MK2DG212777

The Internet auction shall be conducted pursuant to a contract with GovDeals.com, based upon the recommendation of the Finance Director and Police Chief.

SECTION 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare and for the further reason that it is necessary to facilitate the auction of these police department vehicles at the earliest possible time in order to maximize the value recoverable by the public entity; wherefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of Council elected or appointed, it shall take effect immediately upon passage and execution by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
